I'm looking forward to the game tonight and I would like to extend a warm welcome to the Newquay board, management, coaches, players and fans.

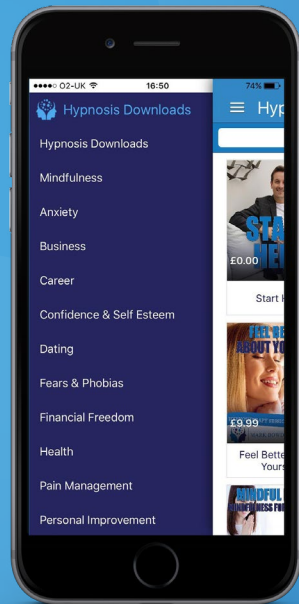
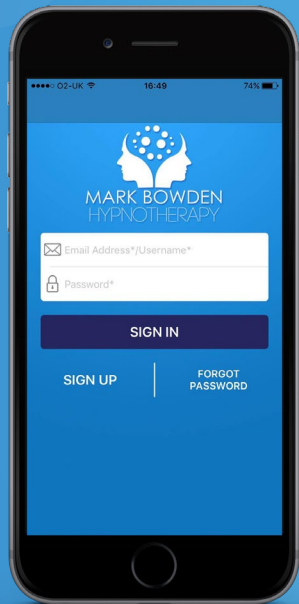

Good evening and welcome to Bolitho Park for our second home match of the week. This evening we welcome Newquay, who despite narrowly avoiding relegation last season, have started this season well winning 2 of their 3 games so far so, as always, we will need to be on our game from the start.

Despite our 4-0 victory over Stoke Gabriel on Tuesday, it was a strange game. The atmosphere on and off the field seemed a bit flat and although we took an early lead, I felt our passing and movement lacked the snap and crispness we had shown in earlier games. After the Stoke keeper was sent off after 20 minutes and one of their midfield players going in goal, we dominated the half and scored 3 more goals before half time without our performance reaching any great heights. Once again the opportunity was taken to make a couple of substitutions at half time followed by a 3rd one shortly afterwards. As we all know, it's sometimes difficult playing against 10 men particularly when they defend deep with men behind the ball as Stoke did. We failed to add any further goals in the second half despite creating numerous chances on and off target and just lacked that bit of guile and quality in and around the 18 yard box, an area in which we need to improve. Having said that, Stoke and their stand in keeper performed very well and continued to frustrate us to the end. Happy to take the 3 points without playing particularly well. Results elsewhere on the night saw us go top of the league on goal difference. Nice position to be in at this very early stage of the season but rest assured no one is getting carried away and we all know there is a long way to go (34 games) and plenty of tough games ahead starting with Newquay tonight.

A pleasing aspect of the season to date is that the 16 goals we have scored have been spread around the squad with 9 different players finding the net so far. I feel it is very important that this continues and that every squad member should be able to contribute goals which in turn takes the pressure off the main strikers when things do not always go their way. 3 clean sheets in 4 games is also a good return and as a team we need to attack as a unit and defend as a unit.

Next Tuesday sees us on our longest away trip of the season to Witheridge (156 mile round trip). At the time of writing, Witheridge are still looking for a manager and they have already suffered some heavy defeats are currently bottom of the league with no points. We must not be complacent, make sure we treat them with respect, maintain our high standards and come home with 3 points. Hopefully we will see some of our supporters make the long trip. The lads do appreciate the travelling support.

The club can trace its roots back to January 1890. It has had many names and variations since that time and are known locally as the 'Towns Club'.

- 1890–1903** Newquay FC
- 1903–1912** Newquay One and All FC
- 1920–1937** Newquay Rovers FC
- 1946–present** Newquay AFC

It is generally thought that Mr G R Card, a master at Newquay Grammar School, was responsible for the introduction of soccer to the town. It was in January 1890, in the grounds of the Newquay Grammar School (now the Pendennis Hotel, Mount Wise) that the first team match took place under the Association Rules. Following this match sufficient enthusiasm was worked up to form the first Newquay Football Club.

Newquay Football Club did not play competitive matches until season 1896/97 when the team were grouped with Truro, Camborne School of Mines, Illogan, St Agnes and Penzance in the Western Division of the Cornwall County Cup (Senior Cup). Newquay won their first trophy in season

1906/07 defeating Looe 4–1 Bodmin to win the Cornwall Charity Shield.

A milestone in the history of the club was in 1921 when Newquay was elected to the Plymouth and District League, but the financial burden proved too great and the club withdrew in 1927. In season 1931/32 Newquay Rovers played in the newly formed Cornwall Senior League and in 1935 won both the League and Cup for the first time.

The Newquay Club was reformed in April 1946 following the Second World War and the first eleven played in the Cornwall Senior League until 1959 when a new senior league was formed, namely the Cornwall Combination League, the Newquay Club was again a founder member and the reserve side has played in that league since that date.

The Newquay Club's nickname of 'The Peppermints' evolved during the turn of the century and was first mentioned in 1906, alluding to the red and white shirts worn by the players, which resembled a boiled peppermint sweet of that time.

MATCH REPORT

SALTASH

PARKWAY

Parkway were unchanged from Tuesday's victory at Cullompton and got off to the perfect start when, after a corner had been cleared, the ball dropped to defender Jordan Trott who smashed home an exquisite volley from around 25 yards. The lead was almost doubled shortly after when Glyn Hobbs was thwarted when one on one with the keeper.

Parkway were dominating all over the pitch and creating numerous chances with Hobbs and Ethan Phillips going close and the Saltash keeper coming under constant pressure and doing well with a couple of good saves. Saltash were struggling to gain or keep any meaningful possession and were having to defend deep with their much vaunted strike force seeing little of the ball.

On 39 mins, slightly against the run of play, a forceful, direct run from deep by Mikey Williams split the Saltash midfield and with Hobbs and Phillips in support, the ball was slipped to Hobbs who cut in from the right and rifled home a shot from just inside the box.

Almost straight from the restart, Saltash saw a shot hit the post with Moore beaten and they remained in the ascendancy. It came as no surprise when they pulled a goal back on 44 mins when former Parkway favourite and prolific striker Ryan Richards, broke clear and scored with a powerful shot at the near post.

Saltash quickly grabbed the equaliser 2 mins into stoppage time when sloppy Parkway defending saw the unmarked Sam Farrant meet a cross from the left and head home.

In summary Parkway controlled the first 25 mins with Saltash the better side in the last 20 mins. Parkway replaced Shane Krac, who had been booked in the first half, and Ryan Lane with Luke

Durham and Josh Tattershall for the second half. Saltash no doubt psychologically boosted by their 2 late first half goals continued to be the dominant side and only a headed goal line clearance by Trott kept the scores level.

Play now became stretched and ebbed and flowed with Hobbs having a good run and shot just wide on 56 mins. Parkway gradually began to regain control and on 65 mins a great run and cross from Williams saw a close range effort cleared off the line. Saltash were now on the back foot with Parkway creating a couple more chances which were well defended.

The pressure finally paid off on 71 mins when after a fine passage of patient play, with Ben Joyce the architect, the ball was released to Phillips who hit a sweet half volley from 20 yards (he reckons 30)! Saltash continued to compete well and the Parkway defence, with Nick Milton and Aaron Bentley outstanding, had to be at their best to contain the attacks. Further chances for Durham and Sam Hilson were well saved and on 81 mins Durham got the goal his hard working efforts deserved when he converted from close range after a left wing corner by Ben Joyce was not cleared.

Parkway had one more chance when, on 86 mins a fine run from deep by Joyce saw his 20 yard strike well saved. As expected, an entertaining, highly competitive match with some quality goals with Parkway deserving the win without probably being at their best for the whole game.

Saltash more than matched them in the periods before and after half time and contributed well to the game. Early days but they will probably be there or thereabouts throughout the season.
