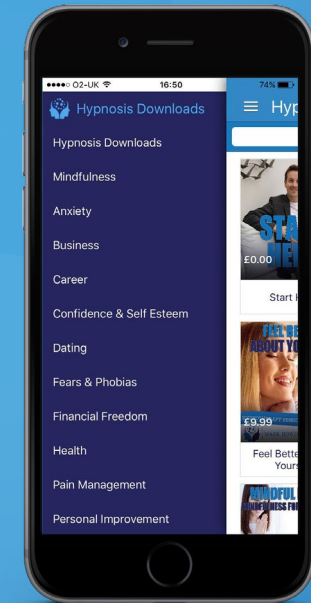
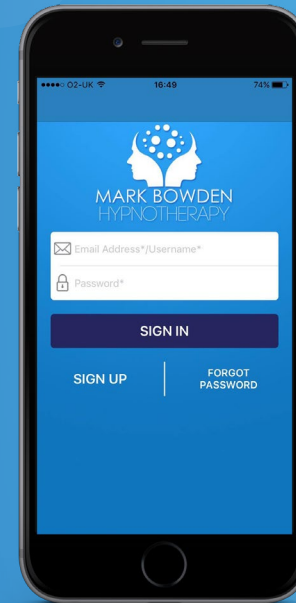

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to Bolitho Park as we return to league action for today's game with Cullompton Rangers, looking to maintain our 100% league record. Cullompton started the season slowly including being beaten 6-0 by ourselves and have also had an early season change of management. Since then, they have put an impressive little run together including inflicting the only league defeat of the season on Plymouth Argyle Reserves and defeating Torquay United in the Devon Charity Bowl. They have also advanced to the next round of the FA Vase by defeating Cribbs of the step 5 Western League last Saturday. They will no doubt be looking to continue that run today and as usual we'll need to be on top of our game and fully committed in all we do.



LEE HOBBS

It was disappointing that the home league game with Godolphin Atlantic was postponed at such short notice with the referee deeming the pitch unplayable at 6 45pm due to too much surface water in some areas. Rest assured that Gary and the staff did all they could to get the pitch playable but sometimes the weather wins. Postponements are unfortunately a fact of life but they do disrupt the rhythm, momentum and progress of the team. The abandonment of the game at Ivybridge at half time due to electrical issues when we were well placed and leading 4-2 didn't help either!! These games have now been rescheduled for later in the season with the Godolphin game currently being our final match.

I was very pleased we have progressed to the 1st round proper of the FA Vase after our 3-0 victory at Wincanton Town. Apart from a 15

minute period in the second half when we had to defend well under a bit of pressure, I felt we were always in control of the game but at 1-0 you are always vulnerable. Once we regained control and scored 2 further goals late on, we were able to see the game out comfortably. An injury to Luke Durham towards the end of the 1st half resulted in a couple of half time substitutions with a slight change of formation and a couple of positional changes for the 2nd half. It is important to be able to make such adjustments during the game and credit to the players for their flexibility and ability to adapt to such changes. At times I felt we tried to force the game a bit too much and we needed to show a bit more patience in key areas. This we did and it paid off in the end. It's always good to go to different grounds and play teams from

other leagues and test ourselves against unfamiliar opposition. We were made most welcome at Wincanton's impressive set up as were the 30 or so supporters who also made the 200 mile round trip. The management and players really do appreciate the away support and we thank them all. We have now been drawn at home in the 1st round proper to another step 6 side, Sandhurst Town of the Hellenic League Division 1 East. They are currently 5th in a 14 team league having played 6, won 3, drawn 2 and lost just once. They beat Ringwood Town 2-1 at home in the previous round and now face a 4 hour road journey to Plymouth. Whilst the league remains our priority, we would want to carry on our winning run in all competitions and see where it takes us.

We have also progressed to the 2nd round of the Devon St Lukes Charity Bowl after a very strange game at Witheridge on Wednesday evening. After conceding an early goal and then racing into a 5-1 lead after 40 mins, I felt we maybe became too complacent, took our foot off the gas and allowed them back into the game before eventually running out 7-4

winners. We will analyse our performance in this game and look at the areas in which we need to improve. We now face the winners of the Tavistock v Exeter City tie at home on a date yet to be decided.

I note the SWPL fair play table as off 15th Sep sees us in 4th position with just 7 yellow cards and no reds from 9 games played. I feel player discipline is an important issue and whilst I expect the players to be fully committed at all times in every game, we must be extremely careful not to pick up unnecessary and avoidable bookings for individual acts of indiscipline, dissent and the like. The last thing we need is to start losing players to suspensions by the accumulation of avoidable cards. If we are to achieve the objectives of the club, we will need all of the squad to be available for selection as often as possible bearing in mind we are more than likely to lose players to injuries and unavailability as the season progresses.

I hope you enjoy today's game. Get behind the lads and thank you for your continued support.

PLYMOUTH PARKWAY RESERVES



Plymouth Parkway Reserves have found life in the ECPL Premier division a culture shock from their undefeated division 1 season last year. With the team facing issues with player availability, a higher class of player and lots more first team players filling in. The season opener saw manager Andy Notman without 8 of his regular players due to the group arranging a holiday together. The side lost 2-1 at home to St Austell who also have now completed the double over the yellows by beating them in the reverse fixture 2-0 a few weeks back now.

The team currently sit in 4th position in the league with a game in hand and are still confident to challenge, though with St Austell and Torpoint absolutely flying, this will be an uphill task.

In cup competition the team are through to the 2nd round of the Devon cup after a tricky away fixture to Hartland Clovelly, and are through to the 2nd round of the SWAZ Teamwear League cup. This weekend they play St Austell in the 1st round of the Fred Binks cup.

Elliot Cunningham currently leads the way in goal scoring with 6 goals to date, though an impressive Travis Mackie is hot on his heels with 4 goals from his first 3 appearances, including a debut Hat-Trick from the subs bench.

16 Year old Jack Rhead has featured in every game so far this season and his impressive start has earned him a call up to the Devon County Under 18's Side.

WINCANTON TOWN VS PLYMOUTH PARKWAY

**Wincanton Town 0
Plymouth Parkway 3 (Hobbs 18, 90+2, Trott 75)**

Parkway started off at a good tempo applying early pressure. Their first real chance came on 10 mins when a shot on target from Glyn Hobbs was deflected behind for a corner. With Ben Joyce and Ryan Lane influential in midfield and the front 3 mobile and fluid, Parkway dominated possession forcing Wincanton to defend, desperately at times. Little was seen of them in the Parkway half but they did manage to break clear on 15 mins ending in a shot going well wide. The Parkway pressure was finally rewarded on 18 mins when good play down the left saw Mikey Williams put in Hobbs who finished smartly from around 12 yards. Parkway continued to create chances but Wincanton defended resolutely with their keeper being well protected and not having to make too many difficult saves. Parkway continued in the ascendancy creating further chances on 25, 33, 34 and 37 mins with efforts from Hobbs, Lane and Williams.

Another effort from Hobbs, cutting in from the right, clipped the post with the keeper beaten. Approaching half time Luke Durham, who seemed to be struggling with an injury, made a great run finishing with a shot on target. A dominant half from Parkway let down at times by erratic finishing and the lack quality of their final ball into the danger area. Credit to Wincanton though who defended well but rode their luck more than once. The interval saw Parkway make 2 changes with Josh Tattersall and Jordan Trott replacing Lane and Durham, a couple of positional changes with Connor Macauley in a more advanced role on the right and swapping to a 4 4 2 formation. Parkway instantly pushed forward with Ethan Phillips shooting wide on 47 mins and a neat 1-2 between Hobbs and Trott ending with Trott firing over on 52 mins. Aaron Bentley then headed over from a

right wing corner as the Wincanton goal continued to lead a charmed life. Frustration began to creep in and "stay patient" could be heard coming from the Parkway dug out.

Wincanton now upped their game and began to see more of the ball with Parkway having to concentrate fully in defence, with their goal coming under sustained pressure for the first time in the game. However they did manage a break on the hour mark when good link up play down the left between Trott and Phillips resulted in the latter seeing his shot rebound off the post. Wincanton continued to press and could and probably should have equalised on 65 mins.

A period of ping pong in the Parkway 6 yard box, with scuffed shots, mistimed clearances, rebounds and frantic defending eventually saw the ball cleared off the line and away to safety. A period of scrappy play ensued with neither side able to keep possession or get control of the game. Parkway did eventually regain their composure and control and on 75 mins, a fine move down the left between Williams and Trott saw Williams put Trott through and he finished coolly with his trusty left foot driving the ball low through the diving keepers legs. This 2nd goal seemed to knock the stuffing out of Wincanton and allowed Parkway to relax a little and see out the rest of the game which they did without too much trouble. They even managed a 3rd goal in stoppage time when Hobbs went on yet another of his strong, twisting, turning runs, leaving 2 defenders in his wake and finishing powerfully from around 10 yards. Apart from a rocky period midway through the 2nd half, Parkway were by far the better side and but for their erratic finishing and stout Wincanton defending, would have won by a wider margin.

Club History

The club was established in 1945 and initially played in the East Devon Victory League, before joining the Exeter & District League. They were Division One champions in 1959–60, earning promotion to the Premier Division. After finishing as Premier Division runners-up in their first season in the division, they went on to win the league title in 1961–62 and 1963–64. However, they were relegated after finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1966–67. After another relegation, the club were Division Two champions in 1972–73 and later won Division One again in 1978–79, earning promotion back to the Premier Division of the renamed Devon & Exeter League and went on to win the East Devon Senior Cup in 1983–84.

In 1993 Cullompton were founder members of the Devon County League. They finished as runners-up in 1997–98 and again the following season, in which they also won the Devon Premier Cup. In 2007 the league merged with the South Western League to form the South West Peninsula League, with the club placed in the Premier Division. Although they finished bottom of the division in the league's first season, they were not relegated.

Ground

The club initially played at Cullompton School Playing Fields, before moving to Speeds Meadow. Although they left Speeds Meadow to play at Knightswood and later Court Drive, they eventually returned to Speeds Meadow.

Floodlights were installed in 1998, and upgraded dressing room facilities were opened by Steve Perryman on 28 February 2012.
