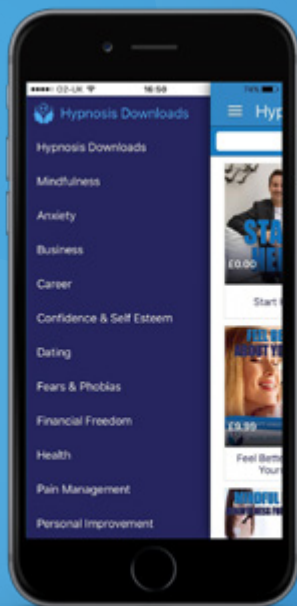

THE GAFFERS NOTES

Good afternoon everyone and a warm welcome to Callington Town who, since our earlier meeting a month ago, have changed their management team and will be looking to improve their results to pull away from the lower reaches of the table. As always we will need to be well prepared and at our best.

Since my last notes we have had 3 victories in 3 different competitions. Firstly the FA Vase game against Bodmin was, as expected, a tough encounter and not without it's controversy. Some will argue that the Bodmin sending off changed the game but it's sometimes more difficult playing against 10 men when they are defending a lead than 11. My own view is that their missed chance to go 3-1 ahead followed by us equalising at 2-2

virtually straight away was the game changer. The momentum shifted in our favour from that point and to come from 2 goals down after 25 minutes to win 4-2 against a tough Bodmin side reflects great credit on the lads, our team ethic and our will to win. We will now entertain Hereford based Westfields in the last 64. Westfields are currently mid table in the step 5 Midland Premier league, beat Willand Rovers 1-2 in the last round and had some high scoring victories in previous rounds. I also note that they reached the 1st round proper of the FA Cup last season, the lowest ranked side left in the competition at that stage. A terrific achievement for a step 5 side so an interesting challenge is envisaged.

Secondly, last Saturday saw us gain a comfortable 5-0 victory league victory at newly promoted Sticker. A couple of minor injuries meant the squad was once again fully utilised and everyone played their part in a very solid all round performance which resulted in us moving 7 points clear at the top of the table. For many it was their first visit to Sticker and I have to say it was a pleasurable experience for management, players and supporters alike. Many have commented on how

well they were received and how such a relatively small club have progressed and provided such good facilities. We thank them and wish them well.

Finally, Tuesday's visit to Cullompton in the 3rd round of the Walter Parson League Cup saw us progress to the quarter finals with a hard fought but ultimately well deserved 5-0 victory.

It's worthy of note that the 14 goals we have scored in these 3 games have been spread around 7 different players plus an own goal. Also to still be involved at this stage of the season in 4 of the 5 competitions we entered is very pleasing and full marks to all the players for their efforts so far. The aim must be to continue to progress in all of them.

PLYMOUTH PARKWAY VS BODMIN TOWN

Plymouth Parkway 4 (Williams 29, Krac 54, Joyce 62, og 83)

Bodmin Town 2 (Carter pen 8, Watson 26)

Before kick off, a minutes silence was impeccably observed by the very impressive crowd of 435. Parkway made 4 changes to their starting line up from last Friday's first defeat of the season including new signing central defender Rob Farkins. With players from both sides having played for the opposition in recent times, an exciting, close encounter was envisaged.

Parkway almost took the lead on 2 mins when Jordan Trott saw his follow up shot from his own blocked free kick hit the base of the post. Bodmin were quickly into their stride dominating the early stages and took the lead on 8 mins. A rash challenge on the bye line by Farkins resulted in a no arguments penalty duly despatched by ace marksman Adam Carter. Bodmin continued to dominate the midfield areas, frequently testing the Parkway defence. Parkway did manage to create a couple of half chances with a Glyn Hobbs header going just over on 10 mins and a long range effort from Ben Joyce also going over on 20 mins. Bodmin generally remained in control and almost took the lead on 21 mins when a free kick from their right skimmed off Parkway defender Nick Miltons head, just clearing the bar. Bodmin doubled their lead on 26 mins when poor defending left Ben Watson unmarked in the box and he floated a superb curling shot into the top corner. Play at times became fractious and fragmented with a number of free kicks against both sides disrupting the flow of the game. The yellow cards also started to appear. Parkway forced their way back into the game on 29 mins when Mikey Williams prodded home from close range after Bodmin failed to deal with a right wing corner. Parkway now began to exert more pressure by winning the midfield battles and a free kick from Joyce on 42 mins clipped the angle of bar and post with Mike Smith seeing his 44th minute effort parried to safety by the keeper, arguably his first real save of the game. The half ended in controversy as Bodmin midfielder Chris McPhee was shown a contentious 2nd yellow card for an alleged foul on Sam Hillson. Connor Macauley replaced Christian Pople at half time for Parkway.

Bodmin surprisingly left 2 up front leaving more space in midfield which Parkway began to exploit with runners

coming from deeper positions. On 50 mins Hobbs was adjudged to be narrowly offside and his effort was disallowed. Arguably the games defining moment was not the sending off but a bad miss on 53 mins by the normally reliable Carter who hit the post from close range when unmarked in front of an open goal. 3-1 would have been a long way back. Parkway broke to the other end almost immediately and equalised when Shane Krac, now becoming more influential, followed up a blocked shot firing home the rebound. Parkway were now in the ascendancy with Williams outstanding down the left. The yellow cards continued to be banished. Parkway deservedly took the lead on 62 mins when a misunderstanding between the Bodmin keeper and a defender saw the ball punched out to the supporters player of the month for October, Joyce on the right hand side of the box and he hit an exquisite low volley into the far corner. A superb strike. Ethan Phillips then replaced Hobbs up front. Bodmin came back into the game, particularly down their right with substitute Sam Matthews prominent. Matthews entered the game with a yellow card hanging over him having been apparently booked when leaving the pitch at half time! Is that a first? Parkway were forced to defend well as Bodmin forced a series of corners from some decent possession. As the game drew to a close Parkway looked the stronger outfit and went further ahead on 83 mins when yet another cross into the danger area was parried against the unfortunate Luke Rundle and into his own net. The ever hard working Smith was then replaced by Ryan Lane who immediately made some forceful forward runs. Parkway were then content to slow the game down, retain possession and see the game out which they did comfortably.

An excellent, gritty effort to come from behind against a decent Bodmin side with Parkway showing determination, commitment and no shortage of skill at vital times. As expected, a tough, at times feisty encounter which hardly warranted a dozen or so yellow cards of which only 3 or 4 were for challenges, the remainder seemed to be for dissent/ungentlemanly conduct.

STICKER VS PLYMOUTH PARKWAY

Sticker 0

Plymouth Parkway 5 (Farkins 32, Hobbs pen 41, 82, Williams 50, Trott 90+3)

Both sides started off at a high tempo with neither getting the upper hand early on. The first chance came on 10 mins when Glyn Hobbs fired just wide after slick build up play. Parkway gradually gained some control and on 13 mins, another good move down the left ended with Mike Smith turning smartly and seeing his shot cannon off the bar and over. The bar took another battering on 18 mins when a trademark powerful run by Hobbs saw his rising drive smash against the bar and away to safety.

Sticker continued to hold their own as the Parkway defence held firm snuffing out their sporadic attacks. The Parkway central midfield trio now began to dominate providing a sound base with Ryan Lane making runs from deep to support the attackers, Christian Pople covering every blade of grass tackling strongly, breaking up play and hardly wasting a ball and Ben Joyce at the base controlling the game, with his accuracy of short and long range passing a delight to watch. Mikey Williams and Sam Hillson continued to push forward in the wide areas forcing Sticker to defend deep. The pressure finally paid off on 32 mins when an inswinging corner from the right by Jordan Trott saw recent signing Rob Farkins, a central defender, rise above a group of players and power home a header from around 6 yards. Parkway continued to press and on 37 mins had a good penalty shout turned down when Williams appeared to be felled. Lane then spooned an easy chance over an open goal after another flowing move saw him put in the clear by Hobbs. Parkway did increase their lead on 41 mins. A tangle of legs saw Smith and his tackler end up on the deck and a penalty awarded, probably less clear cut than the earlier claim. Hobbs then did what he does best. 0-2. Just before the break Kyle Moore, a virtual spectator until now, made a crucial superb double save, pushing away a powerful shot at full stretch and then blocking the rebound. Games can change on such moments.

Parkway went further ahead on 50 mins when a great turn and strike from Hobbs was parried by the keeper with the ever alert Williams following in to slot home the rebound from close range. Sticker continued to defend well, compete strongly in midfield and create

the odd half chance now and then as Parkway began to ring the changes with Mason Hughes replacing Hilson just after the hour. On 65 mins Sticker almost pulled one back when a header hit the Parkway bar with Moore beaten. Luke Durham replaced Smith on 71 mins followed shortly after by Connor Macauley replacing the industrious Williams down the left. Hughes and Durham soon began to link well down the right continuing to pressurise the overworked Sticker defence. Sticker then had a good effort well saved on 81 mins and from the resultant long ball downfield by Moore, Hobbs read the one bounce perfectly and deftly lobbed the onrushing keeper from around 18 yards. Route one at it's best! Sticker then saw another header just clear the bar before Parkway got their 5th in stoppage time. A free kick wide on the right saw Trott curl his left footed effort into an unguarded near post only for the keeper to react too late and bundle it on to the post and over the line. Garry Topsy Turner, stood behind the goal and a couple of the Parkway massive stood behind Trott are both claiming an assist as we both pointed out to him the glaring near post gap!! A thoroughly workmanlike performance from all elements of the Parkway team, solid at the back, dominant and creative in midfield and lively up front. Hard to pick a man of the match as everyone played their part in an excellent all round team effort.

On a personal note, good to have a post match chat with the referee's assistant George Pattison, an old Royal Navy colleague of mine. George has played and refereed at this and a higher level for some time now so knows the game well. Told me it's the first time he's officiated Parkway for some time and was impressed with their performance and sees no reason why they cannot hold their own at a higher level. Thanks George, no pressure then! Finally thanks to the Supporters Club transport coordinator Pat Bullen who organised today's minibus for 25 of the faithful. Just a shame that having to leave some time before the bus did, he opted for a different diversion route because of the closure of the A38 due to the serious RTA. Apparently he arrived back in Plymouth well after our bus!

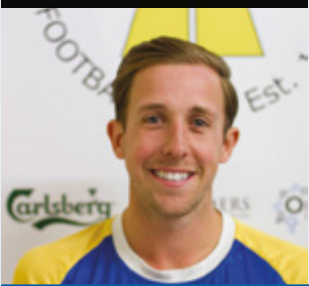

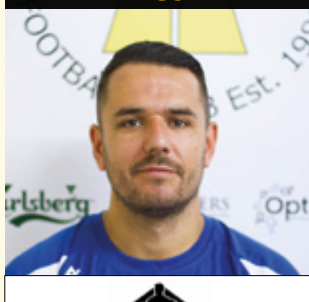

Club History

The club was established in 1989 and joined the East Cornwall Combination the following year. They were runners-up in 1994–95 and went on to win back-to-back league titles in 1997–98 and 1998–99. After their second East Cornwall Combination title they moved up to the South Western League, where they spent several seasons in lower-mid table, finishing bottom of the league in 2003–04.

In 2007 Callington became founder members of the South West Peninsula League, and were placed in Division One West. In 2013–14 the club won the division, earning promotion to the Premier Division; they also won the Cornwall Charity Cup, beating Dobwalls 1–0 in the final after extra time. The following season saw them win the league's Charity Vase with a win over Stoke Gabriel.
