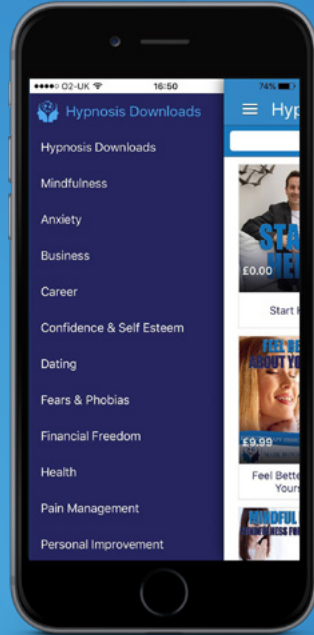

MATCH REPORT

PLYMOUTH PARKWAY VS WESTFIELDS

FT: Plymouth Parkway 2 (Hobbs 29, 62)

Westfields 3 (47, 90+3, 90+5)

Early indications were that it would be a tough game as the visitors looked a strong, physical side with a direct style of play. Both sides created early chances with the best of them falling to Shane Krac who shot just wide after being set up by Christian Pople on 8 mins. Play went from end to end with Parkway being more patient in their build up while Westfields, strong at the back, adopted a more direct approach. The Parkway defence held firm restricting the visitors to a couple of long range efforts. Parkway won a corner on 20 mins with Glyn Hobbs firing just over. The game was becoming an extremely competitive battle in midfield with neither side dominating and both defences generally strong and coping well. Hobbs had another chance, shooting just wide on 27 mins.

The deadlock was finally broken on 29 mins when, ironically, a long ball by Parkway was misjudged by a Westfields defender some 35 yards out allowing Hobbs to pick up the loose ball, surge forward unchallenged, calmly round the keeper and slot home from an angle from around 6 yards. Westfields reacted strongly and almost equalised with Kyle Moore blocking a close range shot and from the resultant corner also saving a well placed header. Westfields continued to look dangerous on the break down both flanks with their direct style and also looked creative from a number of set pieces. On 37 mins Parkway could have increased their lead only to see Hobbs' astute pass just fail to reach the supporting Mikey Williams who was in the clear. Just before the break another Westfields attack down the right saw another effort on target well saved by Moore. An entertaining, hard fought 1st half with both sides having periods in the ascendancy, defences being fully tested and a single defensive mistake and a quality finish from Hobbs the only thing to separate the sides. Westfields certainly looked to have goals in them though.

They almost equalised straight from the kick off with Parkway just managing to clear from close to the line however on 47 mins the equaliser duly came. Parkway failed to clear their lines after a break down the left and a Westfields player cut in and finished from close range. Play continued to ebb and flow with neither side getting on top or creating too many clear cut chances.

Parkway did have an effort on the hour when Krac was put in the clear only to see his clever lob just grasped by the keeper at full stretch. A period of Parkway pressure resulted in them taking the lead again on 62 mins. A trademark strong run from Hobbs saw him cut across from the left, shrug off a couple of tackles and fire home powerfully from around 15 yards. Shortly after this, Hobbs was replaced by Connor Macauley with Mike Smith moving into the central striking role and Macauley going wide right. Parkway then had a decent penalty shout waved away after Williams appeared to have been brought down. Game changer? Westfields now began to pour forward forcing Parkway deeper and increasing the pressure. On 70 mins a cross-cum-shot from distance on the left was superbly pushed over by Moore at full stretch. Parkway continued to dig in and Smith shot just wide on 72 mins with Jordan Trott seeing his powerful free kick punched away by the keeper on 78 mins. Back came Westfields who saw an effort go just over followed by play switching to the other end and Williams shooting just wide after latching on to a Smith header. On 89 mins more Westfields pressure saw yet another effort well saved by Moore. Pople then made a yet another storming run from midfield only to be cynically brought down on the edge of the box with Krac firing the free kick just over. Stoppage time, cue drama! On 93 mins, Westfields now throwing everyone forward broke down the left and from a cross into a crowded box Moore managed to punch the ball away only for it to drop to a Westfield player some 15 yds out who fired his shot against a post only for the rebound to be hammered home for the equaliser.

Almost from the restart Westfields took the lead for the first and last time. More pressure down the left saw Parkway unable to retain the ball or clear their lines with the ball being lumped into the box and dropping to a player 8 yards out who fired home through a crowd of bodies with Moore probably unsighted. With almost the final kick of the match, Parkway went to the other end with Krac's shot just grazing the bar. A pulsating game with a cruel ending for Parkway after such a gritty, gutsy, resolute performance. Despite today's defeat, a terrific achievement to get through 4 previous rounds.



Club History

The original club was established in 1891. They reached the final of the Cornwall Senior Cup in its first season (1892–93), but lost 5–1 to Penzance. After three more losing appearances in the final, they won the cup for the first time in 1899–1900 and retained it the following season. They joined the Cornish & Devon League, but folded in 1907 after their ground was closed, with a team named "The Boys of England" taking over their fixtures.

The modern club was formed in 1922 by a merger of Launceston Saturdays and the Comrades. They joined the Plymouth & District League and were Division Two champions in 1928–29. The mid-1950s saw a sustained period of success as the club won the league for three successive seasons between 1955–56 and 1957–58. They then moved up to the South Western League where they played for three seasons, before leaving in 1961. Although the club rejoined the league in 1962, they left again after finishing bottom of the table in 1965–66, dropping into the East Cornwall Premier League.

In 1979 Launceston returned to the South Western League for a third spell. They won the Cornwall Senior Cup again in 1982–83 and were runners-up in 1983–84 before winning the league in 1994–95. However, after finishing fourth the following season and winning the League Cup, they finished bottom of the league for the next three seasons. In 2004–05 they won the Cornwall Senior Cup for a fourth time, and in 2006–07 they were the last winners of the League Cup prior to the South Western League merging with the Devon County League to form the South West Peninsula League, with the club placed in the Premier Division.
