Good afternoon everyone and welcome to a sold out Bolitho Park for today's game with Shepton Mallet. I hope their staff, management, players and supporters enjoy their time here today.

Our visitors have had a mixed start to the season in the league having drawn 2 games, lost 2 and their only win an eye catching 4-3 victory over Bitton. After 2 wins in the FA Cup they eventually went out to step 3 side Swindon Supermarine and remain in the FA Vase after a 1-0 win over step 6 side Bishops Sutton. Those results indicate that on their day they are capable of raising their game and I expect them to provide a tough challenge today and we will need to be on our A game if we are to maintain our steady progress.

Despite our 0-0 draw at home to Buckland Athletic, I was pleased with our overall performance and were only denied a victory by some resolute defending, inspired goalkeeping, the woodwork on more than one occasion and a dose of bad luck. Credit to Buckland who stuck to their game plan and we can expect other teams to adopt similar tactics when they come here and it's up to us to stick to our beliefs, stay patient and continue to work hard to break teams down.

Our 4-0 victory at Brislington on a difficult surface was a hard fought but ultimately comfortable win. With 3 of our midfielders unavailable, I managed

to rotate the squad and on this occasion swapped 2 of the strikers from the Buckland game. Getting the early goal settled us down and I thought we dominated the midfield areas, defended solidly when required and played with good energy throughout. I have encouraged our midfield players to get forward to support the strikers as much as possible and I was delighted to see our 2 first half goals come from Billy Palfrey and Callum Hall. We created a host of chances and bringing on Ryan Richards and Matt Wright for the last 20 minutes and seeing them both score gave us the perfect finish to the game.

I thought we played exceptionally well at Wellington, particularly in the first half. Again I was able/had to rotate the squad due to injury and unavailability but was very pleased with the overall performance with again the goals being shared around. Also pleased that Craig Veal got off the mark displaying the very qualities for which we signed him. Worthy of note is that of our 26 goals scored to date, we have had 12 different scorers which is exactly what we want to see.

After a busy September of 8 games in which our only defeat was in the FA Cup, we head into 7 games in October which include attractive derbies at Exmouth and Buckland. It's still very early days but I am more than pleased with our league form but we have won nothing yet and we never know what is likely to happen regarding the future impact COVID may have on the season. It's

important that we maintain our momentum, stay focussed and that we remain well placed should the season be suddenly halted, suspended or whatever. You never know.

After being unable to force his way into the starting 11 James Ward has opted to leave the club. James was a valued member of the squad and has figured from the bench on a few occasions. It's a squad game and like most players he wants to be starting games regularly but that cannot always be guaranteed. We thank him for his efforts for the club and wish him well for the future.

Today is yet another sell out crowd and we all thank you for your continued valued support which means a lot. Also thank you to the 30 or so who regularly travel away.

A reminder that since our last home game new regulations have come into force regarding the operating of the clubhouse and bar. Please take notice of the signage and please adhere to procedures that have been put in place to ensure that we can continue to use the facilities in safety and continue to admit spectators to the ground. Remember there are lots of volunteers that are doing their best to help things run smoothly so please remain patient and play the game so we can play our game. Thankyou.

COVID - 19



LETS KEEP PLAYING, KEEP WATCHING AND FOLLOW THE GUIDANCE

The Toolstation Western League is asking fans to support their local football clubs on and off the field this season by observing the Covid-19 guidance. Whilst specific guidance varies from Club to Club, depending on their facilities, supporters are being asked to observe social distancing and avoid close contact with others not in their social or support bubble.

If fans need to access any of the ground's amenities, such as toilets, food and drink outlets, they should check to see if any of them are not in use, and plan accordingly. Maintaining good hand hygiene, using sanitiser dispensers is also advised. Sadly, fans are still being urged to take extreme care when singing or celebrating, avoiding hugs, high-fives and any close contact with anyone not in their household. Like all its Clubs, the Western League has appointed a Covid Officer.

Since his appointment George McCaffery has been supporting Club Officials with their Covid questions. Unlike professional entertainment venues, Non-league football is run by an army of volunteers, who must now ensure their games are Covid compliant, along with the host of other responsibilities they've agreed to undertake on a match day.

George's message to fans is simple, "let's keep playing, keep watching and follow the guidance. We all have a part to play in defeating the virus, especially fans. Don't wait to be told what to do. Use your common sense and support your local Club by helping the volunteers make sure that everything is Covid compliant. If you have any concerns about how a Club is implementing its Covid-19 Risk Assessment, please contact a Club Official, either in person or by email. Remember that whatever your hope for your Club this season, Covid-19 is the one opponent we all want to beat."

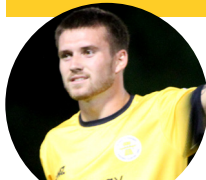

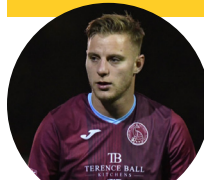

Shepton Mallet were established in 1986 after the liquidation of Shepton Mallet Town. The club is affiliated to the Somerset FA

The old Shepton Mallet Town had spent 10 years in the Western League, six of which in the Premier Division. When that club went bust, the new Shepton Mallet F.C. took the place of the old club's reserves in the Somerset Senior League Division Two, playing at the old club's West Shepton ground.

By 1989, they rose to the Premier Division of the County League and played there until winning the title in the 2000-01 season, when they were accepted into the Western League, and are currently members of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division.

They currently enter both the FA Cup and FA Vase, but do not have a very good record in either competition — only winning one tie in seven FA Cup seasons, and three ties in eight years in the Vase.

This year could be different for the Mallet as big things are expected by many who know the Western League well. Managed by John Durbin and Craig Loxton, the pair have built a team that have the potential to go and have a good season and build a solid foundation for the future.

They have impressed in the FA Cup already with wins over Willand Rovers before they exited against Swindon Supermarine, but they are still in the Vase after beating step six side Bishops Sutton.

They started this seasons Toolstation Western League campaign with two draws against Street and Wellington. They would drop all three points against Roman Glass put would be on the right end of a seven-goal thriller at home to Bitton. They dropped another three points away to Clevedon midweek and will look to get back to winning ways this weekend at Bolitho Park.

MATCH REPORT

Parkway made the midweek trip to Wellington looking to maintain their early season progress. Squad rotation was again in evidence as 4 changes were made from Saturday's victory at Brislington. Jamie Lowry, making his first appearance of the season, River Allen returning from a 3 match suspension, Matt Wright and Ryan Richards started in place of the injured Rob Farkins, Mikey Williams, Levi Landricombe and the unavailable Callum Hall. Billy Palfrey was captain on the night.

Playing down the slope Parkway almost made the perfect state when on 2 minutes a defensive slip saw Wright's snapshot well blocked by the home keeper Tom Welch. Parkway were soon into their stride looking dangerous along both flanks and took the lead on 7 minutes. A swift move involving Lowry, Harrison Davis and Ryan Lane set up Allen who smashed home a low shot from around 25 yards. Scot Merrett then shot over from 20 yards for the hosts as Parkway, looking fluent and playing at a high tempo, doubled their lead on 12 minutes. A move started from deep by the impressive Lowry saw the ball worked through Lane and Allen

who crossed for Craig Veal to send a looping header over the keeper for his first goal for the club since his recent signing. Ryan Richards then saw his angled drive from around 18 yards well saved with Wellington, playing on the break, pulling a goal back on 17 minutes. A near post corner from the right was not dealt with by the Parkway defence with the loose ball dropping to Glen Wright who drilled home through a crowded 6 yard box giving the unsighted Kyle Moore no chance. The goal was the first conceded by Parkway from open play for 7 games and denied them their 6th consecutive clean sheet.

Almost straight from the kick off Parkway restored their 2 goal lead and after more good play between Wright and Richards, Veal rifled a shot high into the top corner to double his tally. With Lowry hitting long range passes to the wide open flanks at will from deep, Palfrey displaying energy and tenacity driving forward and Allen effortlessly exploiting the space in midfield, Parkway were totally dominating the midfield areas. Davis and Lane continued to operate in the wide open spaces on the flanks and looked dangerous every time they went forward.

Wellington rarely threatened being restricted to long range efforts one of which on 25 minutes from Mason Raymond forced Moore into a save at full stretch pushing the ball behind for a rare corner. Another sweeping Parkway move on 32 minutes ended with a dangerous cross from Lane just evading the stretching Veal. On 40 minutes Parkway stretched their lead further which their constant attacking play deserved. Another flowing move along the right saw Davis and Veal link well with the cross finding Allen arriving late into the area to finish smartly from around 10 yards.

Wellington continued to compete well but were allowed little time or space in midfield by the constant pressing of the Parkway midfield trio with the central defensive partnership of Michael Landricombe and Jordan Bentley dealing comfortably with the hosts sporadic attacks. An excellent half from Parkway with the midfield trio and

wide players linking well to create numerous chances and the front 3 looking sharp and mobile. Parkway continued to dominate the early stages of the second half and on 51 minutes a superb 60 yard surging run from Davis ended with his shot being superbly saved by Welch.

On 53 minutes Parkway went further ahead after a smart passage of play between Richards, Lane and Allen along the left saw the latter square the ball to Palfrey who let fly from around 22 yards into the top corner for his 2nd goal in successive games. Both sides made double substitutions on the hour with Levi Landricombe and Williams replacing Richards and Veal both of whom had worked tirelessly and selflessly up front creating numerous problems for the home defence.

Despite the tempo dropping, Parkway continued to control the game and on 68 minutes another blistering run from Davis, who did well to stay on his feet when illegally challenged and the referee playing a sensible advantage, ended with Welch making another smart save. Jack Lewis was then booked for the challenge.

On 72 minutes Levi Landricombe fired wildly over when well placed just before Parkway made their final substitution with Lee Bevan replacing Lane. Parkway continued to control the game albeit at a slower pace but still managed to add a 6th goal in stoppage time. A long ball was headed on by Wright with Levi Landricombe running in behind and harassing the hesitant defender in the 18 yard area, winning the ball and deftly finishing with the outside of his left foot from around 12 yards into the bottom corner.

A highly impressive display by Parkway with no visible weak links with the gulf in class between the sides ultimately reflected in the scoreline. After a hectic start to the season with 8 games in September, 4 at home and 4 away,

Parkway sit on top of the table 3 points clear of Street both having played 7 games but having a vastly superior goal difference of plus 23 having scored 25 and conceded just 2. With their only defeat the exit of the FA Cup on penalties to Saltash United, Parkway

have made an impressive start to their league campaign as they remain undefeated going into October with 7 games to come this month including 2 more Devon derbies away at Exmouth Town and Buckland Athletic. Parkway return to an already sold out Bolitho Park this Saturday with the visit of Shepton Mallet before Wednesday's trip to Exmouth, always a tough place to go. Again credit to the home club for the implementation of the plethora of rules and regulations forced upon them in order for spectators to be allowed into games at this level. It ain't easy for the many volunteers.

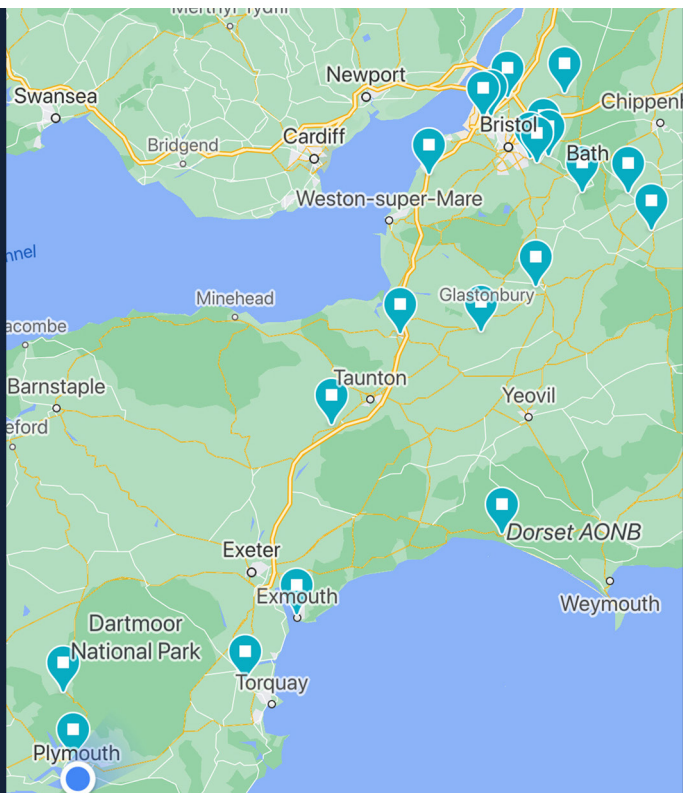
